#### **New General Permit**


- Education and Information








# **Mapping Tool**

### Compliance Schedule

- 3.2 Public Outreach and Education The permittee shall submit to the Department the public education and outreach program developed for the term of this permit as required under section 2.1 of this permit by March 31, 2021.
- 3.3 Public Involvement and Participation The permittee shall submit to the Department the public involvement and participation program developed for the term of this permit as required under section 2.2 of this permit by March 31, 2021.

#### 2020 Cost-Share Matrix for the Respect Our Waters Program

- Total program cost: \$98,900
- Cost allocations are based on population size and MS4 permit area
- The annual cost of the program to members has increased because we are not receiving support from the UNPS&SW Grant in 2020/2021
- Additional contributions will be required to receive assistance with the public involvement permit requirements
  - This amount is still being determined but will follow a similar cost-share structure
